This week we attended a Federation Staff Meeting at Thorverton this week. It is really beneficial for staff to be transferring good teaching practice with their colleagues. The Key Stage One teachers were concentrating on the teaching of Phonics and the Key Stage Two teachers were considering grammar and punctuation. These valuable opportunities can only serve to enhance the teaching and learning that goes on in our Federation schools.

If your children are in class 1 or 2 you may have noticed that the Teaching Assistants were missing today? As part of their professional development they were attending a course on teaching phonics. This will be particularly useful for them in supporting the younger children with their reading, writing and spelling.


The next Nippers Committee meeting will be held on 12th February. Please let Sabine Singleton




